User manager

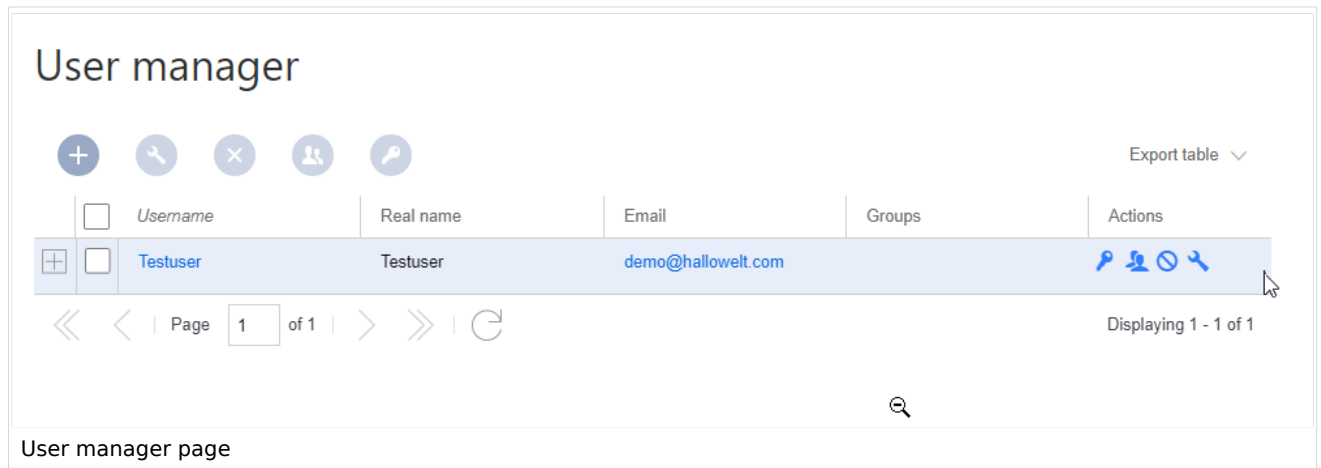
The extension **BlueSpiceUserManager** provides the visual interface for user administration.

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About the User manager

Administrators can access the User manager in the [Global actions](#) menu under *Management > Users* (link to page *Special:UserManager*). It shows an editable list of all user accounts.



Create a user account

To create a user account:


1. **Click** the "+"-button. This opens a dialog.

2. **Enter** the user information in the dialog:
 - *Username*: must be unique and cannot contain special characters
 - *Password and Confirm password*: The password for the new user.
 - *Email*: The email address of the user (optional)
 - *Real name*: can be a duplicate of an existing user's real name (optional)
 - *Enabled*: if checked, user account is active

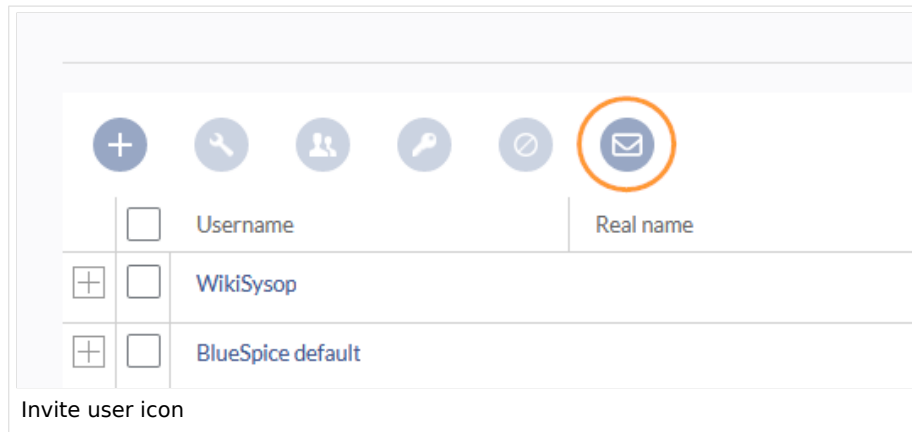
 Available in BlueSpice Cloud and is available from BlueSpice 4.2.

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Inviting a user

The invitation page opens via the email icon in the user administration.



An invitation has the following features:

- Invited users receive an invitation email.
- The invitation email contains a link to the wiki. The invited person can use this link to choose a username and password.
- After the user account has been created by the invited person, there is no special group assignment. The permissions of the general group "user" are assigned to the user account.

The invitation page allows to send an email invitation to new users.

After providing an email address and clicking *Add*, an email is sent to the invited user. The invited person can create their own login information by following the sign-up link in the email invitation.





Delete invitations

Creating user accounts on behalf of users

If an administrator sends out invitations to users to create their own accounts, users can freely choose their username and passwords. As an alternative, administrators can directly create users accounts via the page *Special:CreateAccount*. In this process, users receive an email with a random temporary password, but with a username that was created by the administrator.

2-Factor-Authentication (2FA)

Two-factor authentication (2FA), often also called two-factor authentication, describes a user's proof of identity by means of a combination of two different and, in particular, independent components (factors). Typical examples are bank cards and PINs for ATMs, fingerprints and access codes in buildings, or passphrase and transaction number (TAN) for online banking.

2FA in BlueSpice

The extensions [OATHAuth](#) und [Webauthn](#) make it possible to implement 2FA in BlueSpice. Both extensions are deactivated in BlueSpice 3.2.x by default. They have to be configured explicitly after activation.

- OATHAuth enables 2FA via one-time password
- WebAuthn enables 2FA via FIDO sticks, Windows Hello!, etc.

Single-sign on (SSO): If an external authentication source (SAML, OpenIDConnect und LDAP) is implemented, we recommend to execute 2FA within these sources and not inside the wiki. Compatibility with SAML, OpenIDConnect or LDAP have not yet been tested in BlueSpice.

2FA is not possible with true SSO (LDAP/Kerberos).
