

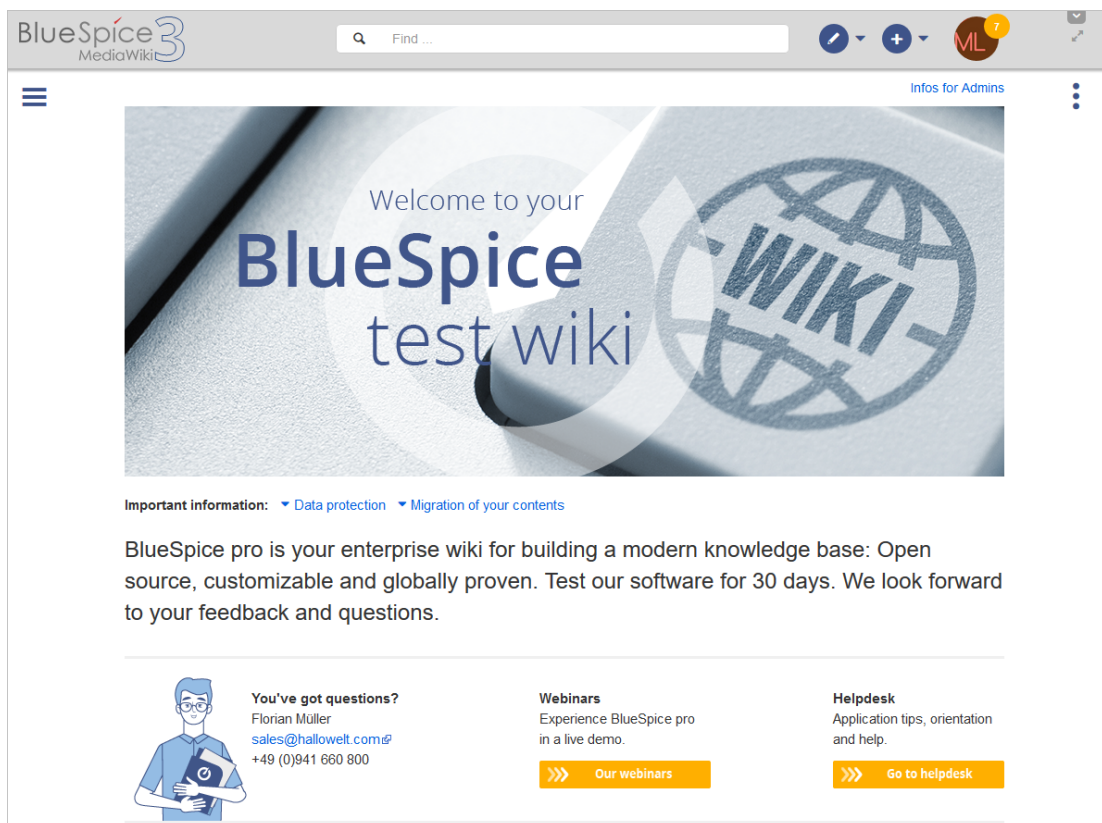

## About hiding the page title

In some cases, it makes sense to hide the title of a page. For example, if you want to create a portal page:



## Usage

In *VisualEditor*, go to *Page options* > *Advanced settings*:
