# **Special pages**

Special pages are an important tool for wiki maintainers to track changes in the wiki and to analyze important information about all wiki pages.

## Characteristics of special pages

- Their main purpose is:
  - $^{\rm O}$  to track changes
  - $^{\rm O}$   $\,$  to view statistics and logs  $\,$
  - $^{\circ}$  to provide bulk editing tools for administrators, (e.g. , global find/replace, import/export pages)
- $^{\circ}$  to detect problems (e.g., broken redirects, uncategorized pages)
- They cannot be created or edited by any user
- They are listed on the page Special:Special Pages
- Some pages are only shown to users with admin rights
- They have their own (pseudo-)namespace Special
- Users with admin rights see more special pages than other users

## Accessing special pages

To access a list of all Special pages, click Special pages in the Global actions menu or navigate directly to the Special: Special Pages page. Some frequently used special pages are also linked directly from the Global Actions menu.

It is not possible to create a redirect page that links to a special page.

#### Useful special pages

Numerous special pages for administrators and wiki maintainers are available. Take some time to click through them and see which ones are useful to you. The overview page also contains all special pages provided by BlueSpice.

If you want to use some specific pages frequently and they are not already listed in your wiki's navigation, you can create links to these pages in your user menu.

#### **Maintenance lists**

- Wanted pages/ Wanted files / Wanted templates: Pages and files that are linked or used on wiki pages, but that don't exist.
- **Dead-end pages:** Pages that do not link to other pages.
- **Orphaned Pages:** Pages that are not linked from or transcluded into other pages.
- **Uncategorized Pages:** Pages that do not belong to any category.
- Short Pages: Pages with little or no content.
- Broken Redirects: Redirects to non-existent pages.

## Lists of pages

- All pages: All pages of the wiki are listed here. The default view shows all pages in the main namesapce. You can switch to any namespace by selecting it from the namespace drop-down menu and then clicking go. If your wiki administrators have set up namespaces that are only used in your wiki, they will be listed at the end of the menu selection.
- **Categories:** All categories that exist in your wiki. If they are shown in red, they are used as tags on pages, but don't have their own wiki page yet.



• List of redirects: Shows all redirected pages and their target pages.

## **Users and rights**

Active users list: Shows the users who have performed an activity in the last 30 days.

User rights: Shows what user groups a user belongs to.

#### **Recent changes and logs**

- **Logs:** Shows all logs such as the *deletion log* or the *move log*) (only available to users with admin rights). An individual log can be picked from the drop down menu.
- **Recent changes:** Lists changes that have occurred recently. Users can save multiple filters to see different views of the change log.

## Data and tools

- **Popular pages:** Lists the pages with the most page views.
- **System messages:** Lists system messages available in the MediaWiki namespace. They can be customized by administrators to override default messages.
- **Replace text:** Allows a global search and replace option for the wiki (admins only).

## **Redirecting special pages**

- Random page: Takes you to a randomly selected page of the wiki.
- Random redirect: Takes you to a randomly selected redirected page of the wiki.

#### High use pages

- **Most used categories:** Displays the categories with the most member pages (with number of members).
- Most linked-to pages: Lists pages linked to most frequently (with number of links).

## Page tools

- **Export pages:** Text and edit history of a specific page can be exported to another wiki using this form.
- Import pages: External wiki pages can be imported here as XML data.
- Import CSV: Allows to create new wiki pages from a csv-file.

The user interface is divided into distinct areas that group various wiki functions in a meaningful way. Here you get an overview of all features of the standard skin "Discovery".

1-Header bar	Contains important elements such as the logo area, the search field and the buttons for various navigation menus (mega menus).
2-Main navigation	The "heart" of the site organization. The navigation links can be customized by admin users. This area also displays the book navigation.
3-Page tools	Contains all the actions that can be performed on a page. In addition, information such as the version history or the page information can be accessed from here.
4-Work area	All content is created and edited here. The work area is divided into the title area and the actual page content.
5-Page appendix	Additional information such as category membership, discussions and attachments are displayed in the supplementary area. In addition, page recommendations and ratings are displayed if they are activated for the page.

## Header bar

The header contains important elements such as the logo area, the search field and the buttons for various navigation menus (mega menus).

Funktion	Beschreibung
1a-Main navigation toggle	Allows users to show and hide the main navigation.
1b-Logo	The logo can be changed using the special page FlexiSkin.
1c-Search field	Page titles that match the search expression are displayed in a quick menu while the search term is being entered. Pressing the Enter key takes you to the search center, which displays the results of a full-text search and allows filtering the results.
1d-"New content" button	The "New" button allows to create a new page. A subpage can be created directly via the submenu or a new file can be uploaded. A multi- upload is only possible via theManual:Extension/ExtendedFileList.
1e-Custom menu	Allows users with admin rights to create an additional mega menu. The button is only displayed once the additional menu has been created.
1f-Global actions	Direct links to many special pages as well as administrative pages of the wiki.
1g-Language selection	If a page includes links to pages in different versions via language codes that were defined in the Interwikilinks, a mega menu is shown for the language selection.
1h-User menu	Users manage their own settings, tasks and notifications here. A red circle appears above the user avatar if unread notifications exist.
1i-Page tools toggle	Allows users to show and hide the page tools of a page.


## Main navigation



Links to the most important wiki pages are shown here. Administrators have the option to customize the main navigation.

## Page tools

The page tools area contains all the actions that can be performed on a page. In addition, information such as the version history or the page information can be called up from here.

3a-Standard actions	Move, Copy, Delete, Refresh
3b-Extended actions	Start a workflow, Set expiry, Set reminder, Set page assignments, Add to book
3c-Quick actions	Export options, Share, Add to watchlist
3d-Page details	Page history, Page information, Browse properties

3e-All actions	Opens a dialog window, in which all possible actions on this page are listed.

## Work area

## **Breadcrumb navigation**

The breadcrumb navigation at the beginning of the work area consists of links that map the path of the current page:

Namespace (=root node) > Pagename > Subpage level 1 > ... > Subpage level x

If the page *<namespace>:Main\_Page* (languae variations: de:*Hauptseite* / fr:*Accueil* / zh:) exists, the root node links to that page.

If this page does not exist, the root node links to "All pages" (*Special:Allpages*) with the namespace selector preset to the respective namespace. If the root node should link to a different page (e.g., *<namespace>:Portal*), then this page needs to be redirected to the page *<namespace>:Main\_Page*.

## Page appendix

To hide the page appendix area, the following CSS rules can be added to the page *MediaWiki: Common.css*:

Hide entire area:

#data-after-content {display:none} /\* Hide discussions and attachments \*/

Hide attachment only (only up to BlueSpice v4.1):

#social-stash-cnt {display:none} /\* hide only attachements \*/

#### Hide discussions only:

```
#social-topics-cnt {display:none} /* hide only discussions */
```

The areas above can also be hidden by namespace, e.g.:

```
.ns-0 #data-after-content, .ns-3000 #data-after-content {display:none} /*Hide only in
some namespaces*/
```

## Overview

Users can customize their personal navigation menu. The mega menu can be opened by clicking on the profile picture in the top toolbar. The user menu consists of two sections: Customizable links and Personal tools. Only the customizable links can be edited.

By default, the menu shows the following information:

- Pages visited (widget PAGESVISITED)
- My edits (widget YOUREDITS)

These widgets can be removed individually when a user customizes the sidebar.

## Visual edit mode

Visual menu editor is available from BlueSpice 4.2.

**Click** *Edit user menu* to switch to edit mode.


#### To add a new menu heading:

- 1. Click Add new element.
- 2. Enter the text for your menu header. In a multilingual wiki, you can also enter a message key.

## Adding links in source editing mode

The syntax used to define the sidebar corresponds to the main navigation. Entries starting with a single star ("\*") create menu headings or sections while entries with two stars ("\*\*") create links.
